General Responsibility: The Youth Care Worker/Youth Support Worker is responsible for supervision and support of youth participants within the Program Site. The Youth Care Worker/Youth Support assumes all duties and responsibilities in accordance with the organization’s philosophy, direction, and policy standards.

Ndinawe Safe House: A sixteen bed facility providing accessible, 24-hour shelter and basic necessities for children and youth who are living on the streets, are at risk of abuse and exploitation, or in need of a safe place to stay. Youth can admit themselves into Ndinawe Safe House without the referral of a child and family service worker. The staff of Ndinawe offer culturally appropriate counseling and recreational services which help youth develop a positive and safe lifestyle in a welcoming, supportive, and safe home.

Chu Manitou Tanka Oyati Tipi (Second Stage House): A transitional home for youth that offers supportive independent living opportunities for youth between the ages of 16 and 17. The program aims to empower youth in a safe and caring environment in which residents can explore and enhance their mental, physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being. Residents have input in program planning as they gain the tools to be active members of community, building skills and confidence while transition into adulthood. All 12 suites are self-contained, individual bachelor apartments with common areas

Tina’s Safe Haven: An Indigenous youth centre which acts as a central hub in our programming which enables us to connect with high risk youth where they can build positive relationships among their peers, connect with supportive adults, and engage in safe, healthy activities. The centre provides youth 13-24 years of age a safe place 24 hours a day, seven days a week providing supports and services targeted at harm reduction, crisis intervention and stabilization to youth that are at risk for or experiencing homelessness, sexual exploitation, family conflict, placement breakdown, and mental health crisis. Additionally, the centre offers structured daily programming where youth can engage in a wide variety of recreational activities, workshops and skill development opportunities and cultural programming.

Qualifications Required:

- A combination of appropriate education and related
- Demonstrated experience in working with urban Indigenous youth, with particular emphasis on at risk, street involved youth.
- Understanding and appreciation for Indigenous culture and traditions
- Strong knowledge of community resources and services available to youth.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills both oral and written.
- Respectful in order to engage people and build helping relationships.
- Flexible in order to respond effectively and positively in diverse situations.
- A team player who encourages an environment that fosters effective results in teams.
- Strong motivational and leadership skills.
- Maintain a high level of independence and self-initiative.
- Ability to work under stressful conditions.
- CPR and First Aid Certification.
- Proficiency in computer use including Microsoft 365 applications (word, excel, forms, etc.).
- Current Criminal Record Check, Child Abuse Registry Check, and Prior Contact Check required.
- Valid Class 5 Drivers License.
